I will be celebrating my 32nd year with InReach on Jan. 2, and have to say that 2021 has been the most challenging year of my career. We started the year in the middle of the COVID-19 crisis, and it has continued to rear its ugly head, although hope is on the horizon.

Our staff shortage is like no other we've experienced – finding and retaining good, quality staff is our number one priority. Providing our over 500 staff members with the pay and other incentives needed for the very important jobs they hold is critical as they truly make a difference in the lives of over 1,100 individuals with developmental disabilities. It is difficult competing with other industries that are raising their hourly pay. We are doing all we can to increase wages by lobbying our legislators for increased funding and dedicating more time and effort to our fundraising campaigns and special events. Our HR team is improving training initiatives and staff incentives, including sign-on bonuses, finder's fees, healthcare benefits, and increased matches in our retirement plan.

With all of the challenges, we have so much to be thankful for and celebrate!! Our accreditation review in September by the Council on Quality & Leadership (CQL) was a great success. We achieved "Person Centered Excellence" and were awarded an esteemed four-year accreditation. The CQL staff member stated, "This is the best agency I have ever seen in all my CQL reviews across the country."

We also opened our new Day Activity Center in June on Clanton Road. It is providing a larger space to spread out and enjoy activities and various classes that we are offering both in person and virtually.

Special thanks to each of you who contributed to our "Colors for a Cause" and "Dream Maker" events. Our Dream Maker video will be available to watch until Dec. 15 at www.DreamMaker2021.com. Dream Maker donations for 2021 may be made through Friday, Dec. 31. They will help us move into 2022 on good footing.

We are looking forward to upcoming spring fundraisers including our "Crown Town Throw Down" which has been canceled the past two years. I really hope to see everyone in person this year!


